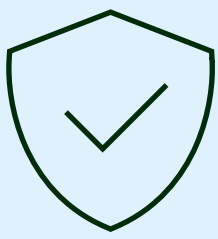


Local challenges: Local government agencies are particularly strained, grappling with increased workloads and constrained by limited resources and budgets.

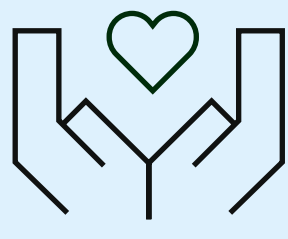

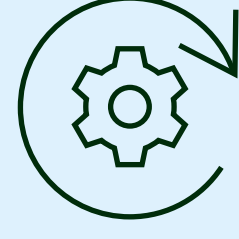

Optimistic outlook: The number of respondents who anticipate an increase in FWA over the next two years has significantly declined, though some believe that advancements in AI technology could contribute to potential increases.



Efficiency as success metric: Efficiency has emerged as a key indicator of success among government departments, especially within local governments, reflecting a shift towards more performance-oriented governance.
